If you are aged 16 or over, you can fill in this form at **gov.uk/register-to-vote**.

You can register as a Crown servant or British Council employee using this form if:

- you are working outside the UK as a Crown servant (e.g. in the diplomatic service or overseas civil service) or as an employee of the British Council.
- you are the spouse or registered civil partner of a Crown servant or British Council employee and you accompany them during their employment abroad.
- your parent or guardian is a Crown servant or British Council employee and you are living abroad with them.

Registering as a Crown servant or British Council employee

- If you are a Crown servant or British Council employee serving abroad or the spouse or registered civil partner of a Crown servant or British Council employee and you accompany them during their employment abroad, you can register at a fixed address in the UK even if you move around. You must renew your application every 12 months, but you can cancel it at any time.
- If you are under 18 and you are living with a parent or guardian who is a Crown servant or British Council employee and you would be living in Scotland if your parent or guardian were not based overseas, your registration must be renewed each year and will end when you are 18 years of age. Then you will need to make a new application to register reflecting your circumstances at that point. You will be reminded to do so before your eighteenth birthday.

How to register to vote

- 3 Return your completed form to us at the address shown above.

You must also be either:

- A British, Irish or European Union citizen, or
- A Commonwealth citizen, or foreign national who has leave to enter or remain in the UK or who does not require such leave.

All information requested in this form must be provided (unless stated otherwise) or your application may be delayed.



Your nationality

You can register to vote in the UK if you are a British (including English, Scottish, Welsh or from Northern Ireland), Irish, European Union citizen, or a Commonwealth citizen or foreign national who has leave to enter or remain in the UK or does not require such leave. We may need additional evidence about your nationality or we may check your nationality or immigration status against government records. If you have more than one nationality, please include them all.

Your date of birth

If you don't know your date of birth please give the date you put on official documents (for example, your passport or driving licence) or tick one of the boxes. Your date of birth identifies you and confirms your eligibility to vote.

Changed your name?

For example, you may have got married and changed your name. You do not have to give us details of your name change but it will help us identify you. If this information is not given then you may need to provide additional documentary evidence.

The open register

There are two registers. Why?

Using information received from the public, registration officers keep two registers – the electoral register and the open register (also known as the edited register).

If you are aged 14 or 15, you will not be included on the open register. You will be included on the electoral register, but only Electoral Registration Officers and their staff can usually see the details you provide. Your details will not be included in any register that is published. About six weeks before an election certain people need details of everyone who can vote in that election. If you will be 16 on the date of a Scottish Parliamentary or local council election, your name and address will be given to people who run the elections, and to candidates who want to provide information to voters. You can find out more information about both registers and how they may be used at **gov.uk/register-to-vote**.

If you are concerned that having your name or address on the register may affect your safety, there could be other options available to you. In certain circumstances, you can register without your name and address showing on the register. To find out more, please contact your electoral registration office. You can find their address on page 1 of this form.

Privacy statement

We collect information under the legal basis of a task carried out in the public interest, as set out in the Representation of the People Act 1983 and related regulations. We will look after personal information securely and follow data protection legislation.

If you opted-out of the open register we will only use the information you give us for electoral purposes, including matching it against other sources of data to support the electoral register. We will not give personal information to anyone else, unless we have to by law. The law requires us to share your information with candidates, political parties and campaigners for democratic engagement purposes and credit reference agencies to check your identity when you apply for credit.

If you have <u>not</u> opted-out of the open register your name and address can be bought by anyone and used for lots of purposes, including direct marketing.

The Electoral Registration Officer is the Controller. They must have a policy document known as a privacy notice setting out how they process personal data. Refer to the privacy notice at <u>www.lanarkshire-vjb.gov.uk</u> or contact us to request a copy.
